Briefly tell us your personal story and how it led you to start your organization.

The year following my Jonathan's stillbirth was without a doubt the worst year of my life. Despite the love family & friends lavished upon us, I felt very alone and I NEEDED to connect with fellow loss moms who knew & understood what I was going through. I needed to know I was not going crazy and the thoughts & emotions I was experiencing were normal. I needed to keep our son's memory alive, and wanted to encourage other grieving families it was okay to do so.

What gap does your organization fill for families? What are the main services your organization provides?

Most grief groups cater more to those who lost a spouse or adult child. MEND serves families who lost a baby prior to birth or shortly thereafter (up to one year of age).

We offer support groups, remembrance ceremonies, social media connections, and we publish a bi-monthly magazine.

Where does your organization provide services?

In person groups are offered in Texas, Oklahoma, Washington, Ohio, Missouri, Michigan, Arizona, and Illinois. We also have online support groups.

What are the greatest needs of families in maternal-infant health you observe through your work?

To have their (our) grief validated; for others to recognize our child died - this wasn't just a "lost pregnancy", it was our baby who died. And for people close to us to always remember, and never forget our child.



What led you to join the NICU Parent Network? And how has the network empowered, equipped, and/or enabled you to grow as a NICU Parent Leader?

I was invited by Lisa Grubbs, in order to add a bereavement resource and representation to NPN.

What is your greatest wish in terms of the positive impact the NICU Parent Leader community can make in maternal-infant health?

I'm very grateful for the opportunities healthcare providers have given to us as parents to hear what we have to say regarding our stories, but I think there's a need for even more respect given to those of us who are "experts by experience". Let us offer more training and insight from a parent's perspective.








2023 EXPENSES SUMMARY
